





Fall always makes me reminisce about the past. I think about how this activity or that activity brought so much joy, fellowship, or enrichment to our lives. I hear this time and time again. I also find myself mourning the activities and events of the past! Our problem is, the reason

these things have dwindled or have been lost is because we have let their fires go dim! So many groups, activities, or events in our life seem to be drifting away! Our Church is no exception to this. I miss Social Hour, I miss Sunday School, I miss Christmas programs, or I miss service trips and I miss.... You fill in the blank!

An example of this is very easy to see with the Social Hour following the service. March of 2020, Zwingli's Consistory voted to take a break from the Social Hour following the Worship Service each week because of the fear of spreading the then life threatening COVID-19 Virus. We put these programs on hold because of the contagious nature of the virus and the fact there was no protection or relief from its symptoms and many who contracted it in the early days passed on! Zwingli Consistory, after careful review of the current situation with the virus and with treatments and vac-

cines that are available, voted to reinstate the Social Hour following the service. This Social Hour is essential to the mission of our Church. We are striving to build a family of believers who care and support one another. Social Hour is just as important as the



Worship Service. The beauty of our Church is in its Greatest Asset, the fact that we have each other. Social Hour is about spending time with our family.

I realize there are a few people who can not physically host the Social Hour, but there are far and away many more people who can! We have had a sign-up sheet in the North Room each Sunday since the end of August and have asked the congre-

gation to sign up to serve... with limited success! There are some new parameters that have been placed on the Social Hour that make the task very simple. Juice, coffee, and a light treat is all that is needed. Even the treat is optional. About ½ hour set up time and ½ hour clean-up is plenty of time to make it happen. Each week since August, we have had over 25 people partake in this event and at the time of writing this note, we are still seeking people to sign up for the next couple of months (November/December)! Is this going to be yet another thing that we can mourn from the past that has died for lack of participation?

This week we finalized our Stewardship Letter and I felt like we may need to visit it again here:

Since 1887, Zwingli has been a community of believers who strive to follow the path of Christ. Striving to follow Christ in faith and in action has been our Mission Statement for many years. The beauty of a Church Community is the fact that "Many hands make light work." We as a Church group (close to 400 members) can impact our town, our state, and our world much more effectively than

anyone of us can alone. This Church has survived challenges of depressions, wars, sickness, and many other hardships, mostly because of the faith our members and friends had in our cause. Our forefathers knew that the love of Jesus Christ and seeing the Christ in our fellow humans is the guiding light to the woes and worries of our world. When there was a need, our forefathers banded together to provide relief. This is why we still have our beautiful Zwingli House of Worship in downtown Monticello.

The sharing of the stories of our Lord has been accomplished through the ages in many different ways: preaching, radio and recording, video and livestream, internet, enrichment and discussion classes, outreach of fellowship and service. All those pale to the actions of our members and the way in which we live, work, and play in our community. Our faith in our Church Community as well as our actions in our lives speak volumes about the walk of Christ.

We have recently experienced a few huge mountains in our path as a Church. COVID-19 lockdowns have decreased our attendance numbers. Our drainage problem left us with a major expense in our Parking Lot that was not expected. The culture that surrounds our Church has also added many other ways of being community in this world for people to choose. The Church has lost its place as the



only social outlet in town. We are slowly struggling to illustrate the joys of living, working, and serving together as a Church to the people of our community. To do this effectively, we need to continue all the programs that we are offering as well as provide even more. We need to continue to reach beyond the walls of our Church, and we need to be the image of Christ in our world.

VOLUNTEER:

This requires each and everyone of us to dig deep and consider how we can support our Church, not just financially, but with our time and talents. Please... Please do not wait for someone to ask you to help. Please come forward and offer ideas and talents as well as funds

to make this Church once again the center of Monticello. We have been operating on a challenged budget for many years and have been leaning heavily on investments and memorials BUT those funds are rapidly dwindling! The time is now for **ALL** of us to dig deep into our pockets and our energy reserve to help build this Church. As we travel through this month of Stewardship, please prayerfully consider what **YOU** can do to make this Church the living heart of Monticello.

was bigger than Joshua could handle on his own. Is this what is holding you back from becoming active in a ministry here at Zwingli?


God is requiring YOU to do what He has called you to do with His help.


This year, we have designated Sunday, November 13, as Stewardship Sunday.




Invitation To Social Hour






