

“Peter Strobel is a child of the Midwest. He grew up in Kansas City, KS, and was baptized and Confirmed in the Evangelical Lutheran Church (ELCA). Growing up in a historically Swedish Church, he learned the importance of coffee hour, eating together (especially by Smorgasbord!), and fell in love with the history of the Reformation and theologies of grace.

In college, Peter went to Doane University in Crete, NE, where he majored in History, with minors in Communications, Sociology, and Leadership Studies. A love of singing and a choir scholarship exposed Peter to the UCC through collaborations with First Plymouth UCC in Lincoln, NE, and annual choir tours to over twenty different states over years.

In his senior year of college, Peter discerned a call to ministry and journeyed to New England to study at Yale Divinity School with Andover Newton Seminary. During Seminary, Peter did chaplaincy at Research Medical Center in Kansas City, MO, and pursued ordination in the UCC. Upon Graduation, he took his first call at Plymouth UCC in Des Moines, IA, to develop as an Associate Pastor through two years of a Transition into Ministry (TiM) Pastoral Residency. At Plymouth, Peter discovered a love for preaching and caring for congregants.

After completing his TiM residency, Peter accepted a call as the Associate Pastor at UCC Norwell in Norwell, MA, where his primary responsibilities were leading the youth group, supervising children's ministry, preaching, and offering pastoral care to families.

Outside of work, Peter is passionate about history and loves to read, go for walks, find new coffee shops, and explore new places with his beloved wife, Allie. Allie is Peter's better half in every way and has added joy and energy to each ministry setting. Allie is working on her Masters in Library Sciences and (fingers crossed) will be transferring to finish her studies at the University of Wisconsin. Responsibilities include:


- Coordinating and participating in Pastoral Care visits

Shine Without Wax



How sincere are you, really? How honest, dependable, and genuine? These are traits that shape our character and help others see Christ in us.



Stop, Look, and Listen


Why should we observe Lent?

We observe Lent because it causes us to STOP. Lent says, "Stop and rest awhile." Lent says, "Stop doing wrong."



We observe Lent because it tells us to LOOK. Look inward for an honest self-examination. Look upward to see the cross of Christ with healing and love. Look forward to the hope of the Resurrection.

We observe Lent because it tells us to LISTEN. Listen to the words of Christ. Listen to the voice of God. Listen to the winds of the Spirit of God.



STOP, LOOK, AND LISTEN.

These three words are important for our safety in travel, but they may also be helpful for our journey through the days of Lent.

Church Cancellation Policy

On various occasions it may be necessary to cancel Sunday morning activities of the Church (Worship and Sunday School). Such cancellations will generally be the result of weather conditions including heavy snowfall (often with associated high winds), extreme cold, or icy road conditions.

1. The Congregation President – in consultation with the Pastor – will be responsible.
2. The decision to cancel will be made by 6:45 A.M. on Sunday morning.
3. Either the Pastor or the Congregation President will notify the local radio station (WEKZ) and Channel 15 to make a public announcement regarding the cancellation.

Guidelines regarding a decision to cancel:

Heavy blowing and blinding snow (whiteout conditions).
Extremely icy roads, Parking Lot, or walkways.
A wind chill warning. Any announcement by the National Weather Bureau deeming conditions to be hazardous.
